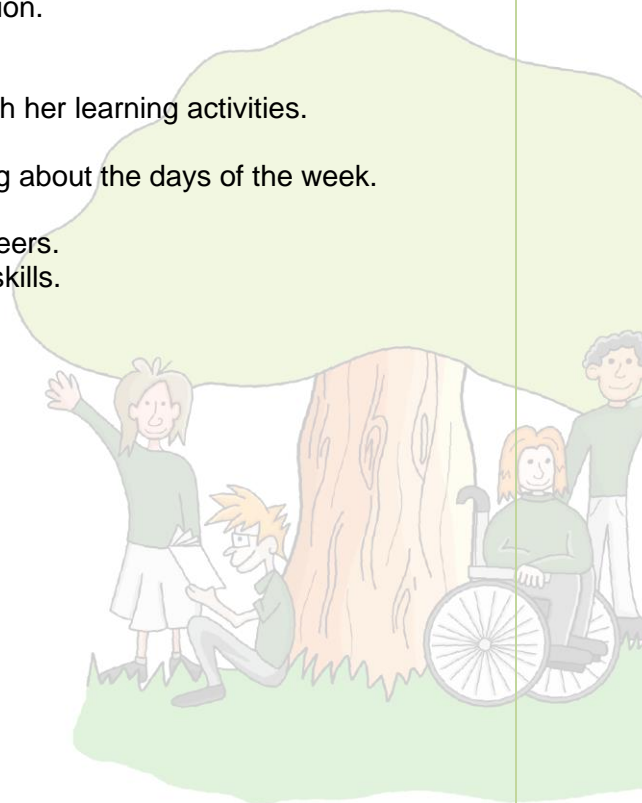

### Sycamore

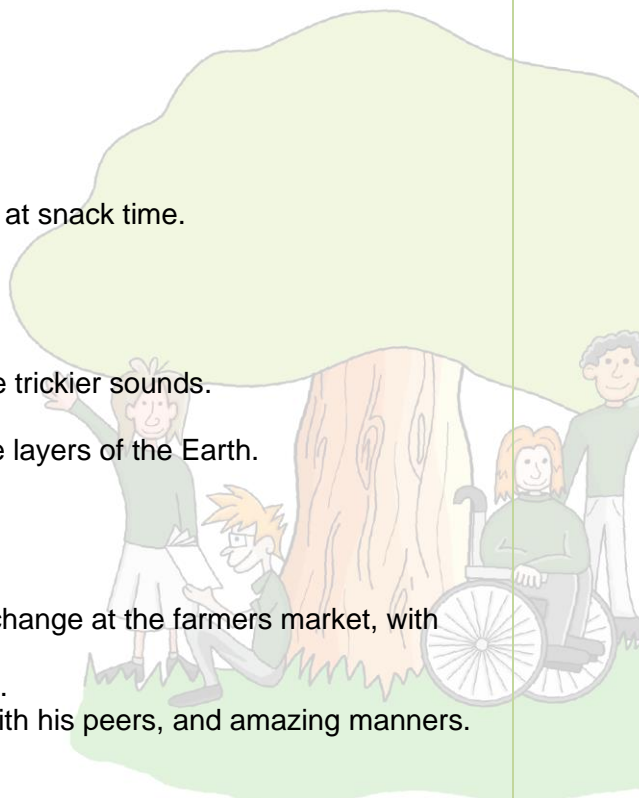
SF for selling scones for farmer's market

Elian for some great work during our Farmer's Market preparation – especially when peeling the lemons!

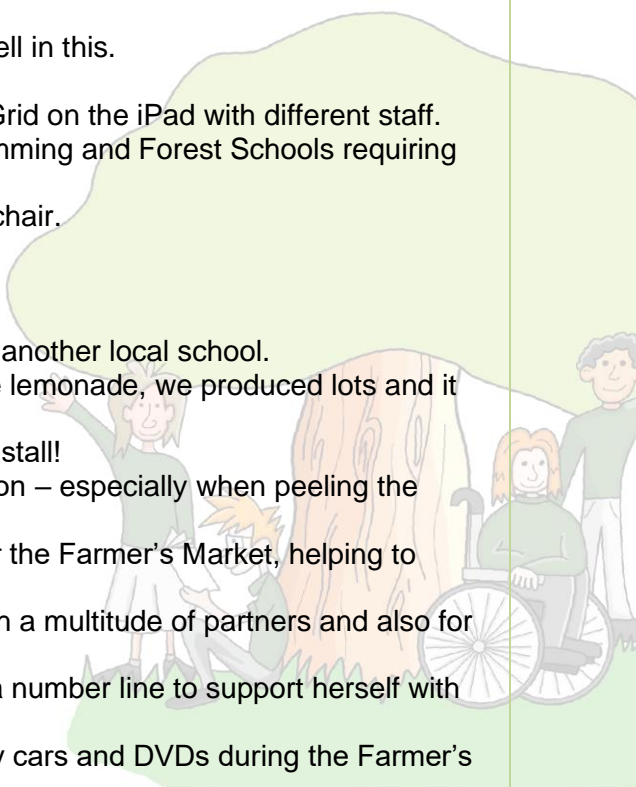
Alfie for some positive work when designing a big sign ready for the Farmer's Market, helping to advertise our homemade lemonade!
