Uniform is not essential at Alfreton Park School. Pupils should wear sensible clothing, which is suitable for school. Uniform is available to purchase, please contact the main office for information. Alternatively, non-logo uniform is also acceptable.

Our uniform colours are:

- A green jumper or cardigan
- A white polo shirt
- · Grey or black trousers, shorts or skirt.

Pupils should wear appropriate school footwear that ensures their safety and is suitable for all activities. Supportive, comfortable full shoes should be worn in class – no open toe sandals or heels.

It is compulsory that all pupils should be provided with the following:

- Swimming costume/trunks and towel
- Swimming pads as appropriate
- PE kit shorts or jogging bottoms, t-shirt, trainers or plimsols
- · Wellington boots or similar as appropriate for your child
- Waterproof trousers and jacket to leave in school for outdoor learning activities
- In summer months, a sun hat and sun cream
- In colder weather, a warm waterproof coat, hat and gloves or mittens
- If your child uses incontinence products or sanitary pads these must be provided as required and wipes as appropriate.

All items must be labelled with your child's name.

PE kits will be left in school and sent home half termly, unless washing is required sooner. Alternatively, you may send your child into school wearing their PE kit on the days they do this.

Please send in sufficient spare clothing if your child needs changing or if you wish him/her to wear outdoor clothing at playtime.
